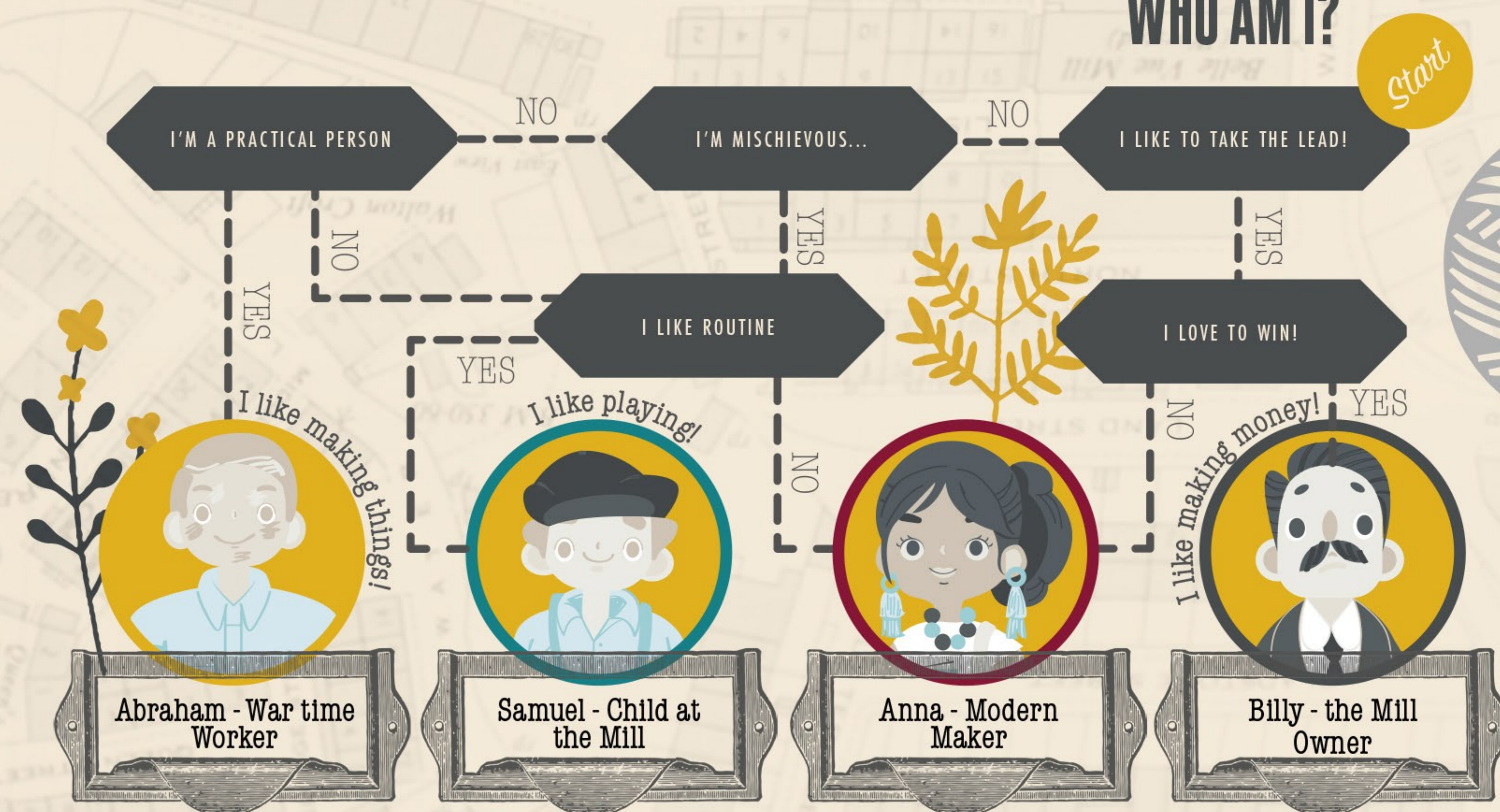
**SUNNY BANK MILLS**

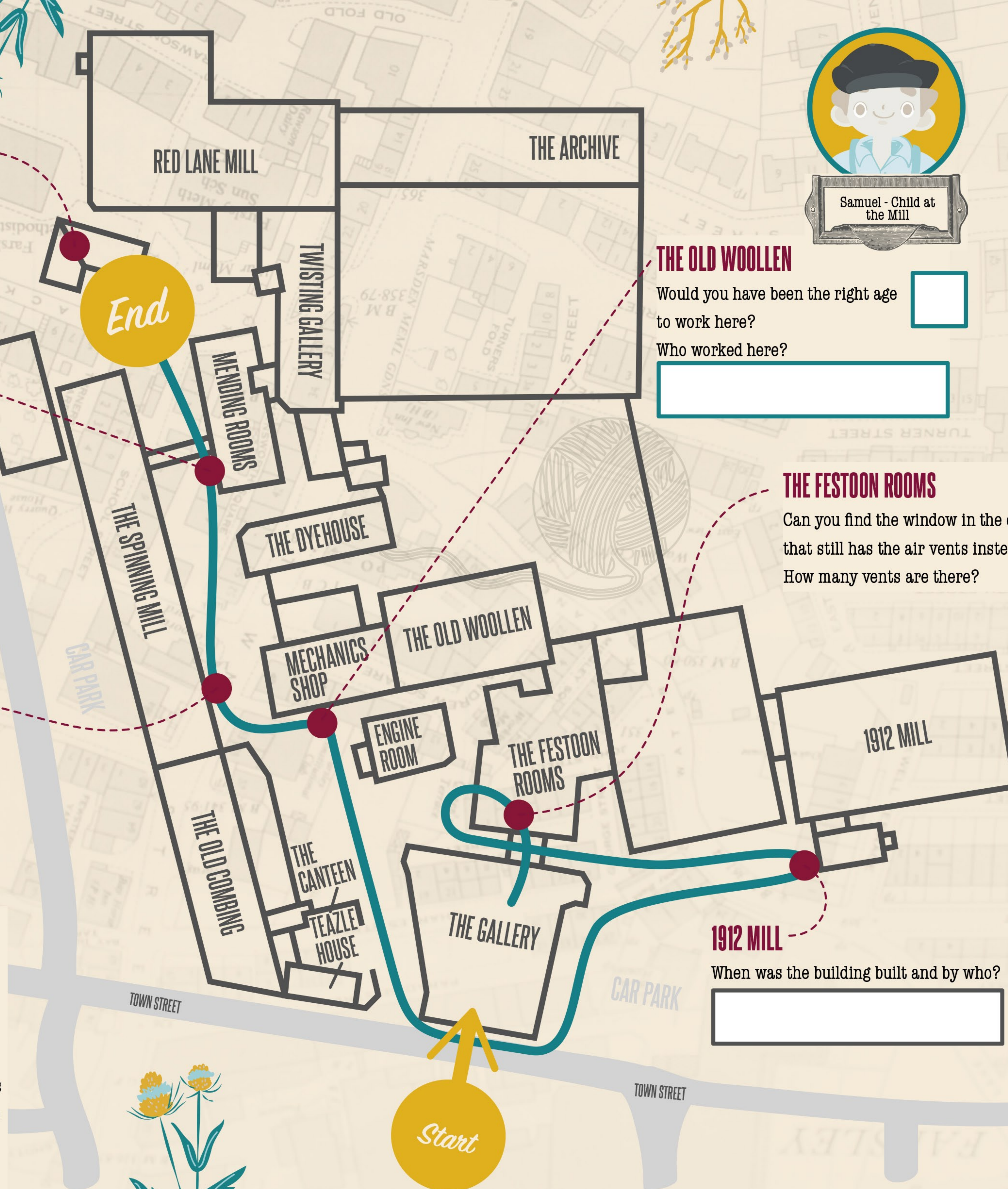
